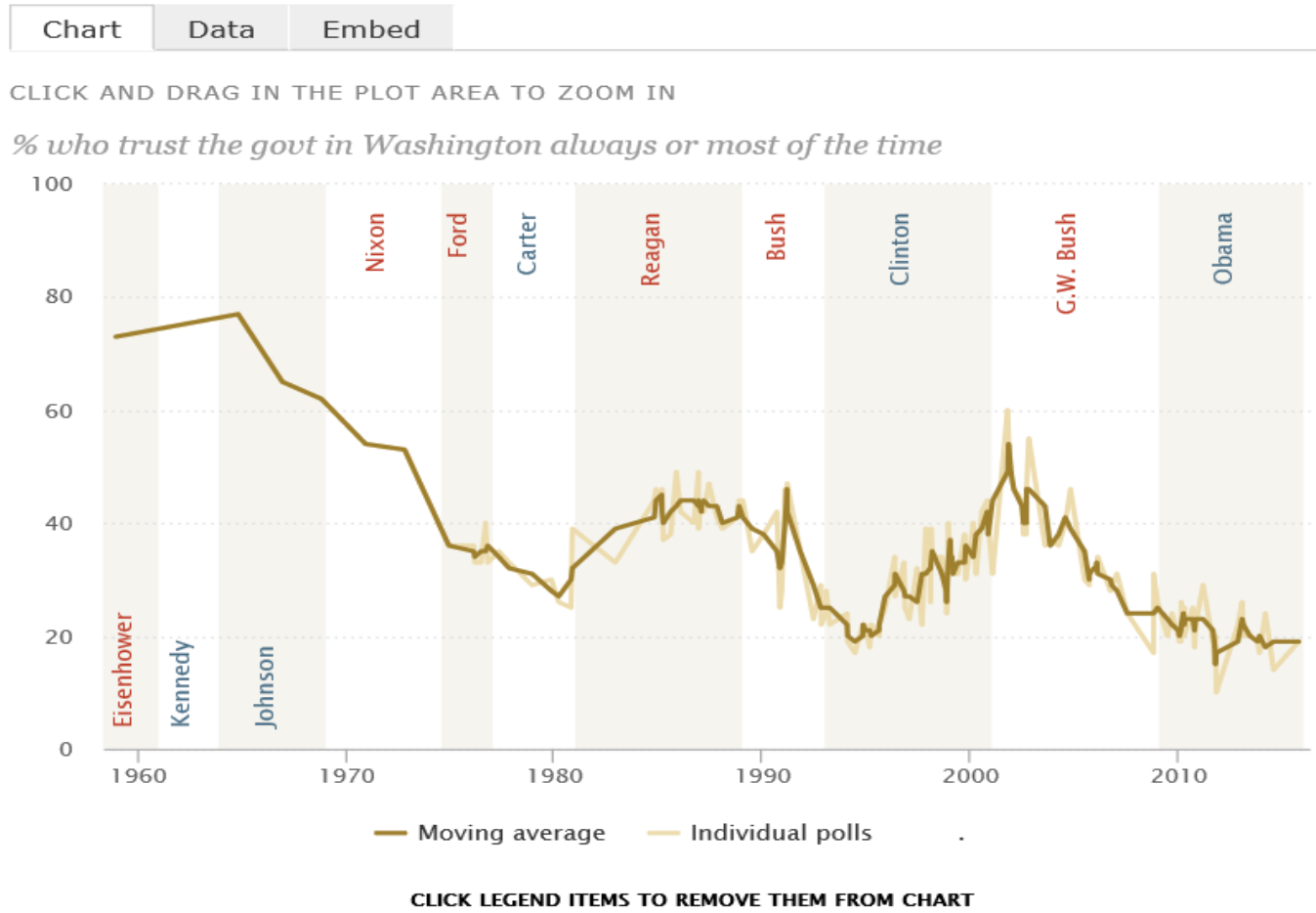
Challenges include:

## Singapore

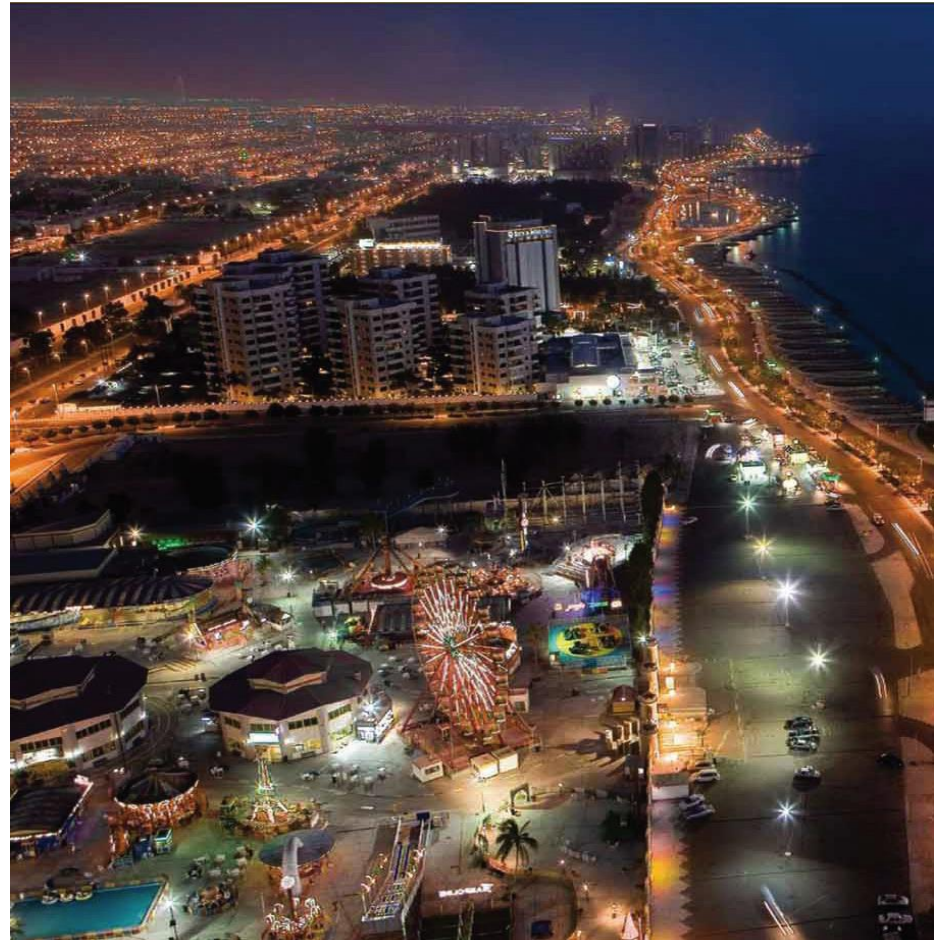
- Integrated performance strategy with a focus on whole-of-government strategic outcomes (e.g. “globally competitive workforce”, “distinctive and vibrant global city”)

- Use of both public and internal key performance indicators



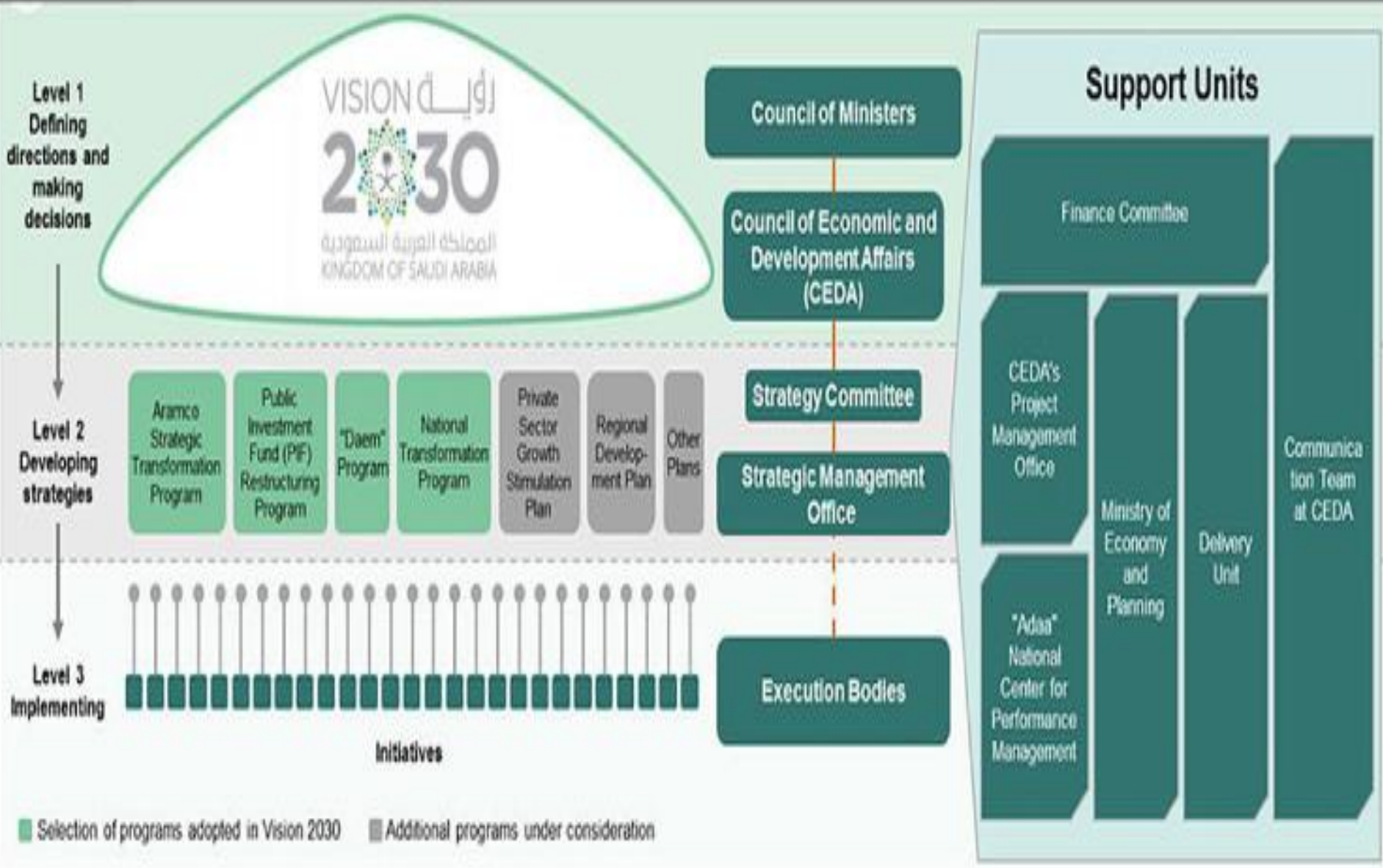
# Snapshot 4
